



How to print a large pattern on a desktop printer




Step 1. Open the PDF file of your pattern in the latest version of Adobe Acrobat Reader. *You can download a free version [here](#).*




Step 2. Click on the print icon.




Step 3. Select your printer, click on the **“Advanced”** button and turn off the **“Print As Image”** option if it’s active.




Step 4. Click on the **"Poster"** button. This will automatically split your large pattern into multiple pages.



Step 5. Activate **"Cut marks"** and **"Labels"**. You will need these for the assembly!



Step 6. Set the “**Tile Scale**” at 100% and leave the “**Overlap**” on the default setting. *You’re now ready to print!*




Optional: If you want to save on coloured ink, tick the “**Print in grayscale**” box at the top before printing.


How to assemble a multi page pattern

(1,1) Document Name.pdf - Date - Time




Step 1. When splitting your file into multiple pages (see *print instructions*), Adobe Acrobat Reader assigns labels to each page. These are usually located on the top left corner. Important are the numbers that we have highlighted here in **red** and **blue**.


(1,1) Document Name.pdf - Date - Time




Step 2. Red represents the column number and blue the row number.



Step 3. Before joining the pages, lay them out according to the correct column and row numbers.



Step 4. Overlay and match the crop marks in the corner of each page and tape them together.



Step 5. Once you're done taping, your pattern will look like this. We recommend you tape the back side as well to prevent the pattern from getting stuck to nearby objects.

You're now ready to cut out your pattern!
